I have a green Irish mat at my front door that says, 'Welcome.' Now, I have not been given the gift of hospitality but I try my best to make people *feel* welcome. I find it quite stressful ensuring people feel comfortable and have sufficient/preferred food/drinks. But I reckon, if we are intentional about being welcoming, it is enough.

I wonder, though, if we are being intentional about welcoming everyone? Do we need to open up our preferred friendship circle and invite someone in we don't usually invite. Can we be more inclusive so that everyone feels welcomed?

No one more than God welcomes everyone and welcomes them equally. God accepts us just the way we are but loves us too much to leave us the way we are. God wants to transform us into complete human beings as exemplified by Jesus. Let's give everyone that opportunity by inviting just one new person into our circle. Who could it be? Who is God laying on our heart?

My prayer for us today is this...

Loving God,

Show us who we can invite into our lives that is feeling marginalised. Let us be your hands and feet, your ears and voice, and your arms as we embrace someone on the edge who doesn't feel like they quite fit. In your impartial and loving name we pray, Jesus. Amen.

Well, it's difficult isn't it! God has just given me 2 to choose from! Think I will go with my next door neighbour. The challenge begins!




